- **I did not take off any points for grammar, spelling, punctuation, or usage. It is your responsibility to check for these items as you revise and proofread. I may have marked some errors, but I did not necessarily mark all of them. I will deduct points on your final paper for these types of errors. USE YOUR PEER REVIEWS, and be sure to PROOFREAD your OWN paper diligently.**
- **Your rough draft grade is likely significantly higher than your final draft grade would be, as I graded rough drafts with extremely limited time.**
- **USE YOUR PEER REVIEW!!!!!!** The changes you need to make **go beyond surface errors**. Spend time considering the coherence and organization of your paper, and use your peer reviews. They are designed to improve your grade. Take the time to *revise* rather than merely *edit*—your final draft grade will thank you!
- I did not check your sources for accuracy, nor did I check for plagiarism, because I did not have sufficient time. I will check for these issues when I grade your final paper, so be sure to correct any problems you have in this area.
- I did not take off any points for minor formatting errors. If I noticed minor problems, I marked them for you to correct before the final paper. If there were issues, be sure to go by the MLA typing guidelines you were given or look at OWL Purdue. I did take off for major formatting errors.
- If I made any marks on your Works Cited page, be sure to make the appropriate changes before you turn in your final draft. You must include a fresh copy as the last page of your final paper.
