- If there were issues with MLA formatting, revisit the MLA typing guidelines you were given or look at OWL Purdue.
- If I made any marks on your Works Cited page, be sure to make the appropriate changes before you turn in your final draft. You must include a fresh copy as the last page of your final paper. Inaccuracy of sources results in a significant deduction (25 points) on final draft.
- The changes you need to make go beyond surface errors. Spend time considering the coherence and organization of your paper, and use your peer reviews. They are designed to improve your grade. Take the time to *revise* rather than merely *edit*—your final draft grade will thank you!
